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COVID- 19 Questions and Answerse of Federal Program Funds

Q2. Can LEAs implementing Targeted Assistance Programs apply for a waiver to the poverty requirement to become a Schoolwide Program?

A2. For 2019-2020, A LEA implementing a Targeted Assistance Program (TAP) may apply for a waiver to the poverty requirement to become a Schoolwide Program. The waiver request should be submitted to the State Department of Education (SDE) by the deadline for TAP applications, which is typically in the month of March. The waiver request should include a letter from the LEA superintendent explaining the need for the waiver and how the LEA will ensure that the program meets the requirements of the law. The waiver request should also include a copy of the TAP application and any other supporting documentation. The SDE will review the waiver request and make a determination on whether to grant the waiver. If the waiver is granted, the LEA may implement a Schoolwide Program for the 2019-2020 school year.

Q3. Will LEAs need to submit a formal waiver request to receive a waiver of the 15% carryover limit on Title I, Part A funds?

A3. No. LEAs are not required to submit a formal waiver request to receive a waiver of the 15% carryover limit on Title I, Part A funds. However, LEAs should submit a letter to the SDE explaining the need for the waiver and how the LEA will ensure that the program meets the requirements of the law. The letter should be submitted to the SDE by the deadline for TAP applications, which is typically in the month of March. The SDE will review the letter and make a determination on whether to grant the waiver. If the waiver is granted, the LEA may implement a Schoolwide Program for the 2019-2020 school year.

Q4. Can Title II, Part A program funds be used to pay for a consultant to create online lesson plans for teachers?
